at the corner of 7th & Camino Real*

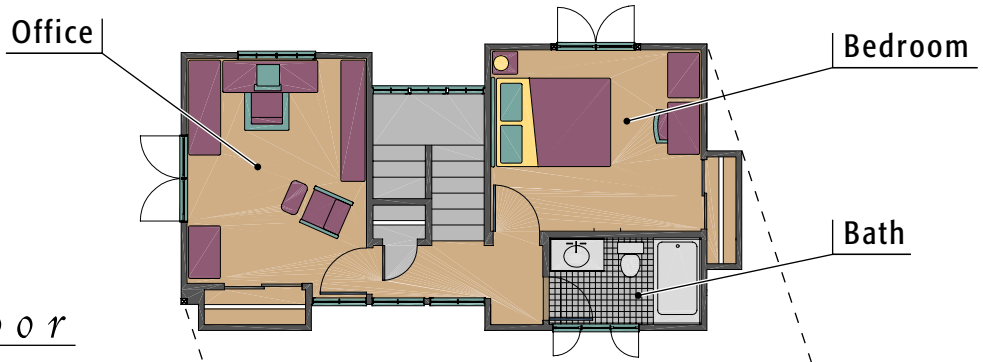
Architect Robert Hayes of Sausalito has created a home perfectly suited to the small-scale rustic charm of Carmel. Situated in the heart of historic Carmel, this home embodies the Carmel Style both inside and out. The design blends the pastoral Craftsman homes of the past with the grand California Mission style.

A small-scale rustic exterior hides an interior of soaring rooms with exposed beams. At the front of the house, the master suite sits atop the first floor like the flying bridge of a yacht, complete with views and sounds of the Pacific. The living room, dining room, family room, kitchen, and kitchen nook wrap around and open onto a central courtyard. This south-facing courtyard invites all kinds of activities, from formal entertaining to simply relaxing in the warm Carmel sunshine. The second floor offers two more-private rooms—perfect for a guest bedroom and an office suite.

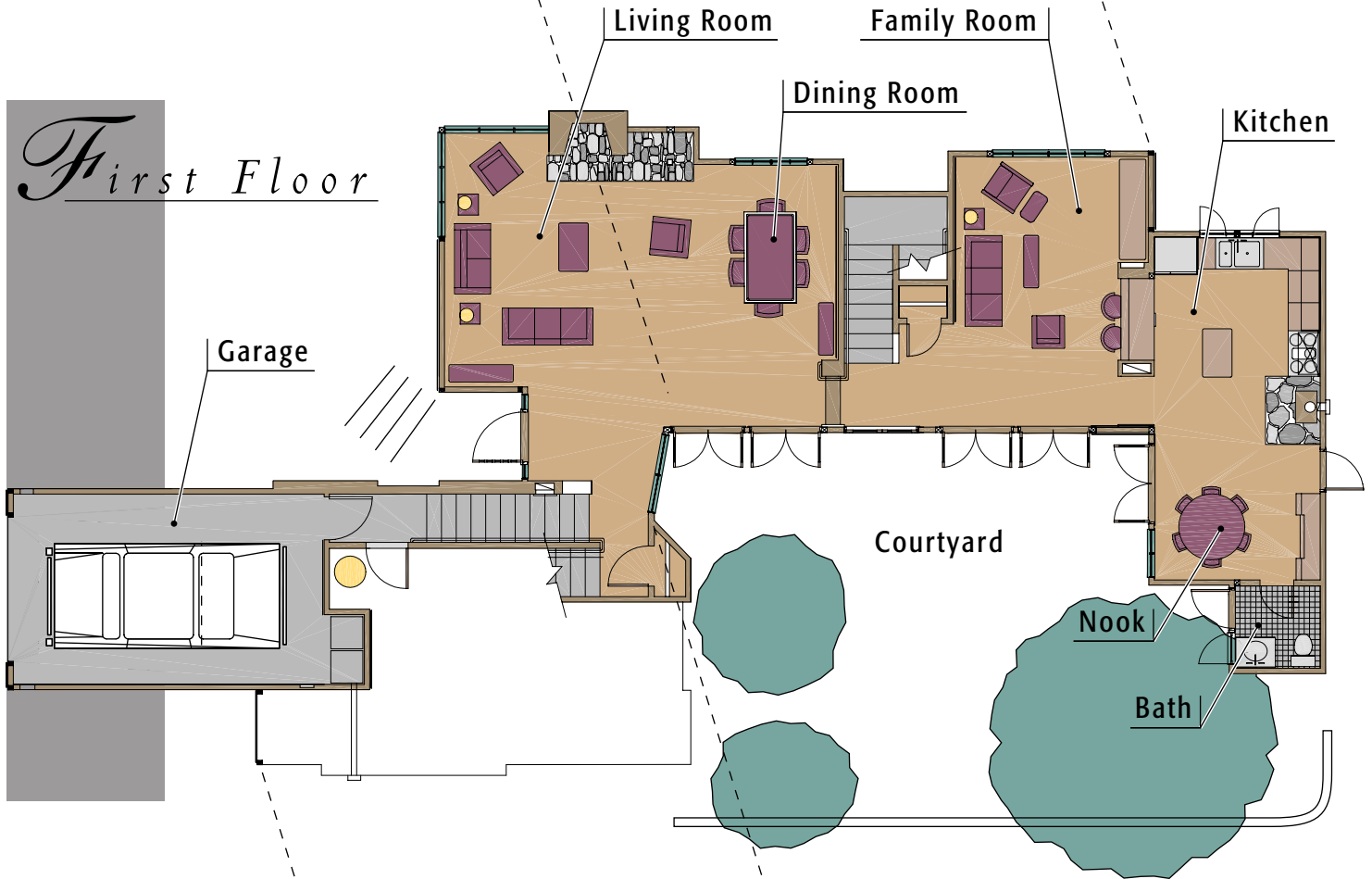

Scheduled for completion in December 1999, this is truly a classic Carmel home.

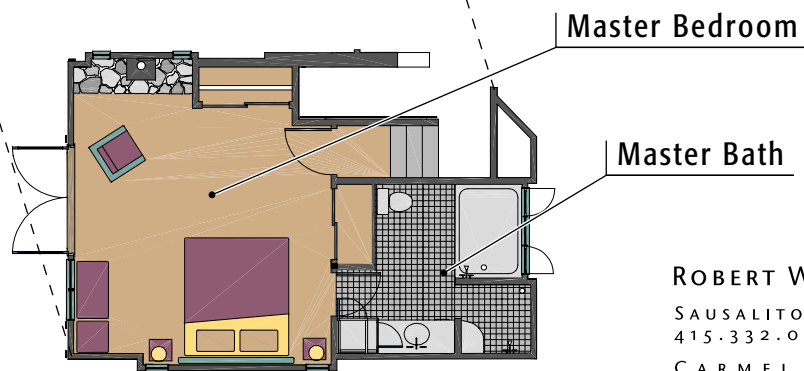
Second Floor
